## Warkworth

Thank you to all our amazing trapline volunteers and backyard trappers. We have achieved much success this year.

- We have welcomed many more backyard trappers, thank you for joining us and helping to protect our native environment.
- 69 fewer possums call Warkworth home.
- 289 rats caught along the riverbank from the cement works to Mahurangi College
- A staggering 245 pests caught in Kowhai Park thanks to 1 dedicated trapline volunteer
- Backyard trappers have notified me that 146 rats, 24 possums, 25 mice and a few hedgehogs have been caught. Well done, backyard trappers.
- Walking in our lovely parks and reserves show many native seedlings establishing from seeds left untouched by predator feeding.
- Many native trees planted in local reserves
- A huge number of weeds removed by a small but dedicated team

- Schoolchildren both secondary and primary continue to be engaged in learning and volunteering in their local environment
- Two halo projects of trapping and baiting have been started and well supported by landowners to the north and south of the township.

We can be very proud of these achievements and celebrate the help we have given to our native flora and fauna.

On the negative side, I think our main concern is the funding crisis impacting on all environmental organisations such as ours.
